With respect to the quality of relationships, what are the signs of a healthy Christian fellowship, in general? What are the signs of an unhealthy Christian fellowship?

# Read and Discuss:

# <u>James 4:1-12</u>

#### <u>Vv 1-3:</u>

1. What does James see as the root cause of Christians quarreling with each other? How does this quarreling affect the community's prayer life? 2. Why does James link interpersonal friction with coveting?

# <u>Vv. 4-6:</u>

- 1. What is the connection between quarreling, coveting, being in friendship with the world, and pride? (Can you summarize the exact nature of the problem James is speaking to in vv. 1-6?)
- 2. In what way is friendship with the world in direct contradiction to friendship with God? What does this look like practically?

### <u>Vv. 7-10:</u>

- 1. Imagine a community of Christians that is coveting one another's worldly goods and thus has distanced itself from God through pride. What does James say about the nature and importance of repentance here?
- 2. How does one, by an act of the will, "submit to God," "resist the devil," "purify the heart," "grieve and mourn," and "humble oneself"? (What does this look like in practice?)

#### <u>Vv. 11-12:</u>

- 1. This community not only covets but it also slanders and judges. What does it mean to "slander"?
- 2. What is the relationship between Christians who judge and God, the Lawgiver and Judge? How are these Christians, according to James, "judging the law" when they judge one another?

1. How does James connect Christians' relationships with each other with their relationship with God?

- 1. Do you ever fall prey to coveting, slandering and judging other Christians?
- 2. How does humbly submitting yourself to God and resisting the devil affect your relationships with other Christians you have a hard time loving? Why is repentance usually so difficult to do?
