#### **Introduction:**

Think back over your last week at your place of work and among your relationships. Can you think of any times when you treated certain people better than other people? Have there been any clear examples of your showing favoritism, or of your being prejudiced?

#### Read and Discuss:

#### James 2:1-13

#### <u>Vv 1-7:</u>

- 1. The issue being discussed here is pretty straightforward. Summarize it.
- 2. Give examples of how the sort of discrimination being critiqued in this passage occurs today in our churches. Do we treat people differently, based solely on their class or economic status? What are other examples besides rich/poor where we sometimes discriminate today?

3. How does God view people differently than we do?

#### Vv. 8-11:

- 1. How does showing favoritism break the commandment, "You shall love your neighbor as you love yourself"?
- 2. In what sense is showing favoritism just as bad as murder or adultery?

#### Vv. 12-13:

- 1. What is James' point about the "law" and "freedom"?
- 2. What does it mean, "Mercy triumphs over judgment"? How are mercy and judgment related?

## **Application**

- 1. It sounds so obvious and reasonable: we are to treat all people equally. And yet most of us do in fact show *some* degree of favoritism towards *some* people. What kinds of people do you tend to treat with favoritism, or look down upon? Why?
- 2. When the secular world observes Christians, would it say many of our churches do indeed show favoritism towards certain kinds of people?

### Prayer
